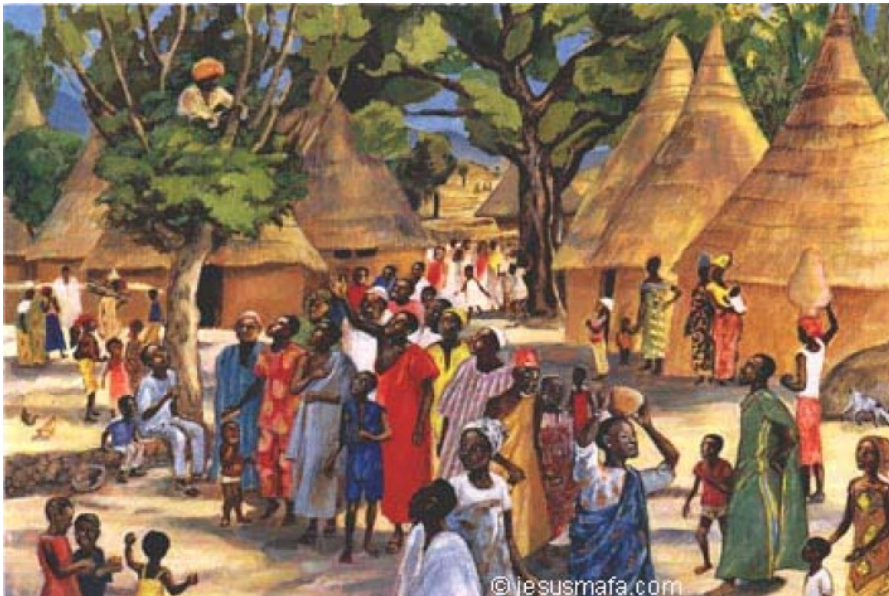
Community Group: The Most Important Thing in Life

There are so many choices in life. Often times, people have a hard time knowing what to do and how to live. For example, what is your dream job or place to live?

We will talk about how we can have a meaningful and purposeful life by understanding that God has a plan for us. The following is a story about a man who was also wondering how he should live. Before we read, let's consider the culture the story takes place in.

In the first century, the Roman government, which ruled over Israel, took Jewish people and made them tax collectors for their own nation. A Jewish tax collector was a traitor to his people. Basically the tax collector would collect money for the government, but anything over that amount they would keep for themselves. In this story, Zacchaeus, is called a "chief tax collector," which means he is very rich by cheating his own people. Naturally, his own countrymen hated him. He was considered the worst of the worst.

Luke 19:1-10



Jesus entered Jericho and was passing through. A man named Zacchaeus lived there. He was a chief tax collector and was very rich. Zacchaeus wanted to see who Jesus was. But he was a short man. He could not see Jesus because of the crowd. So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore-fig tree. He wanted to see Jesus, who was coming that way. Jesus reached the spot where Zacchaeus was. He looked up and said, "Zacchaeus, come down at once. I must stay at your house today." So Zacchaeus came down at once and welcomed him gladly. All the people saw this. They began to whisper

among themselves. They said, "Jesus has gone to be the guest of a 'sinner.'" But Zacchaeus stood up. He said, "Look, Lord! Here and now I give half of what I own to those who are poor. And if I have cheated anybody out of anything, I

will pay it back. I will pay back four times the amount I took." Jesus said to Zacchaeus, "Today salvation has come to your house. You are a member of Abraham's family line. The Son of Man came to look for the lost and save them."
