

**1. Start by taking a few minutes for the group to observe and discuss the art. \*\*\*\*\***

**Begin the Conversation:**

Describe what you see in the painting; what do you notice?  
What questions would you like to ask the artist?  
Does the painting suggest a story? What might the story be?

**Facilitator Responds to comments by:**

Restating their observations and remaining neutral.  
Avoiding to agree or disagree with the observations given.  
There is not a right or wrong answer to their opinions and observations.

**2. Next read the text**

Take turns reading the questions. Give everyone a chance to respond.  
Don't dominate the conversation.

**3. Suggested uses for the cards**

They are great conversation starters for people wanting practice in English conversation, either one with one or with small groups.  
They can be used as a team building exercise, to learn about each other and discuss topics of significance.
