Ceremonies and rituals are used to celebrate and signal a change or accomplishment. Rituals usually have to do with the prescribed order of a religious ceremony. "At the communion service, the bread was given before the wine."

Sometimes the word ritual is used in a general sense of something done in the same way each day. "My household chores have become a morning ritual."

Ceremonies are a formal act performed as prescribed by ritual or custom such as a wedding ceremony or a Japanese tea ceremony. Sometimes the word is used in a general sense as something that is commonly practiced, like handshake.
